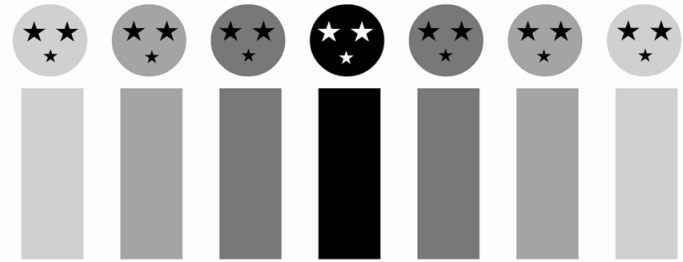

Program Information

FEE POLICY

The fee for each course is \$100.00. Some courses do have additional material fees.

All classes must be paid for at the time of registration. Cash, checks, and credit cards are accepted. Returned checks will be charged a fee of no less than \$15.00 and no more than the amount that our bank charges us. If you have previously had a returned check for the CFK program, you must pay in cash or by money order. **NO REFUNDS are given unless a course is cancelled.** Courses are cancelled at the discretion of the Director.

FOOD

A supervised lunch hour will take place from 12:00 - 1:00. We ask that students bring their own lunches, although hot food will be sold. We will also be participating in the free lunch program through WCCUSD. There are 15 minute breaks between classes.

BEHAVIOR

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that facilitates instruction and the learning process. Disruptive students will be dismissed from the program without a refund. All students and their parent/guardian are required to complete the *Behavioral Contract* attached to the *Enrollment Application*.

Visitors in the classroom are not permitted without prior permission of the director. As a general rule we do not allow visitors the first two days of classes.

CHILD CARE

Before and after program care is now available from 7:30 - 8:30am and 4:30 - 5:30pm. Please call our office for an application. Space is limited to participants registered for all four class sessions.

TRANSPORTATION AND SAFETY (IMPORTANT)

DROP OFF AND PARKING: Parents will be given specific directions for entering and exiting the college campus. These regulations are employed for the child's safety, so we ask that parents and children strictly adhere to these policies. CFK is not responsible for unattended vehicles, or vehicles parked in permit areas, which may be ticketed. Day permits may be purchased from machines in each lot . There is also metered parking available.

AFTER CLASS: Please pick up students no more than 30 minutes after the end of the students last class. *If your child has not been picked up within these times, you will be charged for CFK employees to supervise your child.*

SAFETY: All CFK participants are required to stay in the designated areas under the supervision of CFK staff members. These areas are the quad and amphitheater. Upon enrollment, you will receive a campus map with the designated areas marked. SPPD is also on campus to ensure student safety.

Students will be escorted to and from the restroom during class by their class aide. During lunch, CFK staff will be present in front of the designated restroom areas. Students are not allowed to enter the library during the lunch period.

STUDENT ID CARDS

All CFK students will be required to get a picture CFK ID card from the main office. The students will be required to wear these ID cards at all times. This is to enable staff to easily identify CFK participants

STUDENT SUPPLIES

Students are required to bring their own basic school supplies with them to class. This includes pencils, pens, erasers, and lined paper. Other supplies will be provided unless noted in the course description.
