As of spring 2017, there are **130** international students at CCC. They represent **1.9%** of total student head count at CCC.




Figure 1. CCC International Students Countries of Residence

We welcome students from **all over the world**. As shown in figure 1, we can see the regional diversity of the international students currently here.

These students are on F-1 visas and have F-1 statuses. This is a nonimmigrant status that allows them to study at a U.S. institution. In order for them to maintain their status, they are required to take a minimum of 12 units for fall and spring semesters (summer is optional).

Where are the CCC international students from?

Incoming (New & Transfer) F-1 International Students

NEW students include students who:

- ❖ Are completely new to the U.S.
- ❖ Have previously visited the U.S.
- Have studied at a different U.S. institution.

TRANSFER students refer to students who are studying at a U.S. institution, maintained F-1 status, and have transferred to CCC.




Figure 2. Total New & Transfer Students

We see a decline in the number of applicants for spring 2017 and fall 2016 in Table 2. This is likely due to the reinforced English language proficiency requirement that was implemented for spring 2017.

However, we see that the yield percentage (table 2) has increased in spring 2017. This means that out of the population that applied, the percentage of people who actually enrolled, is higher in spring 2017 than compared to fall 2016.




Figure 3. New & Transfer Students Countries of Origin

Majors/Program of Study




Figure 3. International Student majors/ program of study at CCC.

Transfer Data

International students at CCC transfer to all different types of U.S. institutions. The most prominent is the 4-year transfer pattern to UCs and CSUs. These transfer paths are offered to all students, which includes international students.

A majority of international students transfer to Universities of California (UC) and California State Universities (CSU). However, there are also international students who transfer to private institutions and out-of-state institutions.

The graph on the right indicates the percentage of the reasons why international students come visits the office.




Figure 4. Displays percentages of reasons why students come into the office.
