

# Public Health Occupations Labor Market Information Report

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research December 2018

# Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be a significant undersupply of Public Health workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region (Alameda and Contra Costa Counties). The annual gap is about 2,495 students annually in the Bay region and 745 in the East Bay. However, if Bachelor's degrees are included on CIP codes offering potentially similar programs, the gap drops to about 2,160 in the region and 410 in the East Bay.

This report also provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for programs on TOP 1201.00 -Health Occupations, General in the state and region. It is recommended that this data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for Contra Costa College students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the sub-region, region and state, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Contra Costa College and in the region.

## Introduction

This report profiles Public Health Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a proposed new Associate of Science Transfer Degree at Contra Costa College.

• Health Educators (SOC 21-1091): Provide and manage health education programs that help individuals, families, and their communities maximize and maintain healthy lifestyles. Collect and analyze data to identify community needs prior to planning, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating programs designed to encourage healthy lifestyles, policies, and environments. May serve as resource to assist individuals, other health professionals, or the community, and may administer fiscal resources for health education programs.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's Degree Training Requirement: None Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 29%

• Social and Human Service Assistants (SOC 21-1093): Assist in providing client services in a wide variety of fields, such as psychology, rehabilitation, or social work, including support for families. May assist clients in identifying and obtaining available benefits and social and community services. May assist social workers with developing, organizing, and conducting programs to prevent and resolve problems relevant to substance abuse, human relationships, rehabilitation, or dependent care.

## **Educational Supply**

There is one community college (Contra Costa College) issuing six certificates annually on TOP 1201.00 – Health Occupations, General. In addition, two postsecondary institutions are issuing two Associate degrees and two other postsecondary institutions are issuing 336 Bachelor's degrees on CIP codes potentially offering similar programs. The total annual supply is 344 awards for the region and the sub-region.

# **Gap Analysis**

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 2,502 annual openings for the Public Health occupational cluster and eight annual awards for an annual gap of 2,494. In the East Bay, there is also a gap with 754 annual openings and eight annual awards for an annual gap of 746. However, when including Bachelor's degrees issued on CIP codes potentially offering similar programs, then the gap drops to 2,158 in the region and 410 in the sub-region.

Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
