Fall 2022 online course restriction update from U.S. Immigration (June 1, 2022): The Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) and Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) just released an update to regulations clarifying online enrollment restrictions for the fall 2022 semester: The temporary waiver to online course enrollment restrictions for continuing students only applies to F-1 students who were actively enrolled at a U.S. school in active F-1 status on March 9, 2020 (spring 2020 semester) and have continuously maintained their F-1 status. Students who enrolled and arrived with an initial I-20 after March 9, 2020 (after spring 2020 semester), must adhere to <u>existing immigration regulations regarding online</u> learning (Links to an external site.): Code of Federal Regulations - C.F.R. 214.2(f)(6).

<u>This means that all students inside the U.S. must be enrolled in a fully in-person</u> or in-person/partially online course as part of their 12-unit minimum full-time course load for fall 2022. If you will be inside the U.S. for fall 2022, you may need to adjust your schedule in accordance with these regulations.</u>

Check the program start date listed on your I-20. If the program start date listed on your I-20 is *after* March 2020, you must enroll in a fully in-person or in-person/partially online course each semester as part of your 12-unit minimum full-time course load, if you will be inside the U.S and have an active I-20.

As these regulations are issued by SEVP, not DVC, <u>no exceptions can be made</u> to the in-person course requirement.

PLEASE NOTE: Continuing students with active I-20's who are staying *outside* of the U.S. do not need to take a fully in-person or in-person/partially online course as part of their 12-unit minimum full-time course load, however, you must inform ISO if you are studying fully online outside of the U.S. for any semester.

As a reminder, under normal circumstances, F-1 students have online learning restrictions that require mostly in person enrollment. Continue to read messages and announcements from the ISO to stay up to date on current regulations for F-1 students.
