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WHAT IS AB 540?

- CALIFORNIA ASSEMBLY BILL 540 passed in 2003
- Allows eligible non-US citizens to pay California resident tuition
- Since 2003, there have been 3 expansions to the policy, allowing more students to qualify.
 - AB 2000 (2014), SB 68 (2017), SB 1141 (2023).
- Allows students to qualify for California Dream Act (CADAA) state financial aid.

WHY IS IT A BIG DEAL TO BE A CA RESIDENT? (CCC)

CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGES

RESIDENT \$46 per unit Full-time unit load = 12 units	RESIDENT Total: \$552 per semester \$1,104 PER YEAR	Difference:
NON-RESIDENT \$358 per unit Full-time unit load = 12 units	NON-RESIDENT Total: \$4296 per semester \$8,592 PER YEAR	~\$7500 PER YEAR

WHY IS IT A BIG DEAL TO BE A CA RESIDENT? (CSU)

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY (CAL STATE)

RESIDENT

Varies, usually ~\$7,000-8,000 per year (highest is Cal Poly San Luis Obispo \$11,955 per year)

NON-RESIDENT Varies, usually \$7,000-8,000 per year AND add \$396 per unit ~\$11,752-\$12,752 per year Difference: ~\$4752 PER YEAR

WHY IS IT A BIG DEAL TO BE A CA RESIDENT? (UC)

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (UC)

RESIDENT \$19,236 PER YEAR

NON-RESIDENT \$53,436 PER YEAR Difference: \$34,200 PER YEAR

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CA RES vs. NON-RES TUITION

RESIDENT (PER YEAR)	CCCs: \$1,104 / year	CSU: \$7,000-\$8,000 (varies) / year	UC: \$19,236 / year
NON-RESIDENT (PER YEAR)	CCCs: \$8,592 / year	CSU: \$11,752-\$12,752 (varies) / year	UC: \$53,436 / year
DIFFERENCE RES VS. NON-RES	CCCs: ~\$7,500	CSU: ~\$4,752	UC: \$34,200

HOW DO YOU PAY CA RESIDENT TUITION?

- If you are any status except US CITIZEN, you will be asked to provide immigration documents to community college, CSU, and UC. Pending statuses are OK!
- Why? State requirement must be in an eligible immigration status to to be considered resident for at least one year prior to term starting.
- You may also be asked to provide additional documents.
- YOUR DOCUMENTS ARE NOT SENT TO ANY FEDERAL AGENCY, kept confidential at the college/university.
- AB 540 is your back up plan (undocumented or other statuses)

FINANCIAL AID AND AB 540?

<u>FAFSA</u>: US Citizen, Permanent Resident, Asylum, Refugee, T visa

OR

- <u>California Dream Act (CADAA)</u>: Any other status, including undocumented
 - TO QUALIFY, MUST BE AB 540 ELIGIBLE.

- California Dream Act (CADAA)
- CCC/DVC/LMC: under "Student Forms" tile in <u>InSite</u>
- Not sure? Contact your Admissions & Records Office at the community college
- UC/CSU: Student portal or contact Registrar's Office

- Complete the AB 540 form online (in most cases).
- Submit answers to 4 questions on the form.
- Send an official copy of your high school transcript to your college or university...with a confirmed graduation date!

HOW TO FILL OUT THE FORM: **QUESTION 1 - IMMIGRATION**

1.) Check One Box Only

I have a current nonimmigrant visa (not including a T and U visa) as defined by federal law. Nonimmigrants have been admitted to the U.S. on a temporary visa and include, but are not limited to, foreign students (holding F visas) and exchange visitors (holding J visas). Current T or U visa

I have a current nonimmigrant T or U visa as defined by federal law.

I do NOT have a current, nonimmigrant visa as defined by federal law. This includes, among others, U.S. citizens, permanent residents, DACA recipients, and individuals without current or valid immigration status.

HOW TO FILL OUT THE FORM: QUESTION 2 - ATTENDANCE

- Check your college email for confirmation that your application was received / processed.
- Submit documents if requested...if not, you will be charged non-resident tuition.

NEXT STEPS

- Complete <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>CADAA</u> (financial aid app).
- Submit AB 540 application (if needed).
- Make sure official FINAL transcript with graduation date is sent to college or university - after you graduate from high school!
- If you've been in CA for less than 3 years, talk to us! There are different ways to satisfy AB 540.
